REOPENING OF CIVIL AVIATION ACTIVITIES IN STATES UNDER NATIONAL RECOVERY PLAN (NRP) PHASE 1, 2, 3 & 4

PUTRAJAYA – The Government of Malaysia has announced a new list of Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) relaxation for all States under Phase 1, 2, 3 and 4 of the National Recovery Plan (NRP). The restriction lifted includes the operation of all aviation activities including flight training and examination which takes effect on 25th September 2021. The following operations shall be referred to below:

- CAAM One Stop Centre (OSC) is open for renewal of pilot license only. All air crew must book an appointment on CAAM's online appointment booking system, *e-Temujanji* prior to visiting CAAM OSC.
- Permit application for carriage of dangerous goods will be done online via www.bless.gov.my. Collection of approved application can be made at the designated drop box located at Lobby, Podium A, CAAM Putrajaya on Monday to Friday from 09:00am to 04:00pm.
- 3) For any matters pertaining Airworthiness Division and Aerodrome Standards Division, a drop box is placed at Lobby, Podium A, CAAM Putrajaya on Monday to Friday from 09:00am to 04:00pm for the purpose of submitting applications and other relevant documents. Fee payments shall be made via Electronic Fund Transfer and submissions after 01:00pm will only be processed the next working day. All licences issued by Airworthiness Division will be sent to applicants via courier.
- 4) All aviation training and maintenance activities shall resume operation while observing the SOP and guidelines as issued by the National Security Council (NSC) and the Civil Aviation Authority of Malaysia (CAAM). Listed below are the applicable organisations and trainings:
 - a) Approved Training Organisation (ATO)
 - b) Aviation Approved Training
 - c) Maintenance Training Organisation (MTO)
 - d) Maintenance Repair & Overhaul (MRO)
 - e) Continuing Airworthiness Management Organisation (CAMO)

CAAM is closely monitoring the situation regarding COVID-19 and should there be any changes to the current status, CAAM will notify its aviation stakeholders accordingly. Advisory Information 07/2021 Rev 4 dated 6th August 2021 is hereby superseded.
