Summary of Application	MAVCOM had previously granted an individual exemption to All Nippon Airways Co., Ltd. ("NH") and United Airlines, Inc. ("UA"), (collectively referred to as the "Parties") on 11 May 2017 for a period of five (5) years, for their joint venture arrangement in respect of scheduled air passenger services between North America and Malaysia via transpacific routes which exemption ended on 10 May 2022. NH and UA had submitted an application to renew the individual exemption which application was deemed submitted to MAVCOM on 28 January 2022.			
	The joint venture is governed by a Transpacific Joint Venture Agreement ("JVA") entered into by NH and UA, which has already been implemented in markets between Singapore, Japan, North America, South America and the Caribbean.			
	Under the JVA, the Parties aim to achieve metal neutrality where all passenger revenue from the routes operated under the JVA are redistributed to each Party. Through the JVA, the Parties engage in joint pricing, revenue management and sales, in addition to coordinated marketing, frequent flyer programmes, airport operations, and information technology. The objective of the JVA is to enhance and provide greater options of scheduled air passenger services on routes between cities in Asia and North America. The Application provides that the joint venture would give rise to the following benefits for Malaysian travellers:			
	(i) fare reduction;			
	(ii) maintenance and expansion of network;			
	(iii) improvement in the quality of online connecting services via Narita Airport;

- (v) cooperation in relation to frequent flyer programmes ("FFP") allowing travellers to enjoy seamless FFPs;
- (vi) expansion of offerings to corporate clients for their onestop shopping; and
- (vii) increased operating efficiencies and cost reduction.

The Application also provides that the benefits above are proportionate to the detrimental effects of the JVA.

On 19 October 2022, MAVCOM issued its decision to grant an individual exemption to the Parties' JVA for another five (5) years, ending 18 October 2027.
